







# Careers Afternoon - Update

Volunteers are happy to chat to parent/carers about job opportunities in their field as well, should you also be interested.





Our new Outdoor Gym is being installed this week. It will be ready for the children to use after half term.





# Parent/Carer Questions & Responses



Questions/comments on the day	School Response
I am unsure if my child is on track with their learning. Communication about how they are doing academically and the homework set is not as clear as I would like it to be?	<p>If you ever have any questions or concerns regarding your child, please arrange a meeting with your child's teacher via Mrs Crabb.</p> <p>If you feel a further meeting is necessary to resolve any outstanding queries, please see Mrs Crabb and she will arrange an appointment with a member of the Schools Senior Leadership Team.</p> <p><i>(Mrs Reader ensured the parent received the information they wanted by the end of the week).</i></p>
What happens to my child if we can't afford for them to go on a school trip, or residential?	<p>They are educated at school with any other children who haven't joined the trip. Whilst at school they are likely to do some group work linked to their current topic or an upcoming event at the school. If there are only one or two children not going, they will join another class &amp; complete work set for them.</p> <p>The residential trips are federation trips and so Arreton and Oakfield may organise federation activities for those who have chosen not to go at either school.</p> <p><i>Year 6 families, please remember that you can apply for a subsidy and if you qualify, a proportion of the cost of the trip can be covered.</i></p>
How do I get a meeting with Mr Williams, the school SENCO?	<p>Contact Mrs Crabb and she will get a message to Mr Williams and he will contact you to agree a date. Alternatively, e-mail, using the school 'contact us' tab on the schools website and Mr Williams will e-mail you back.</p>
The Talk from Urban Saints, regarding the Year 5 residential, was not very professional and left parents wondering how aware they actually were of our schools visit.	<p>Mrs Reader followed this up with Miss Dalling who was also present at the talk and she agreed that they did not come over as professional or prepared as we would expect.</p> <p>As a result, Mrs Reader is visiting the premises for herself this week to ensure that she gets all of the information that should have been shared with parents and at the same time will use this opportunity to pass on feedback to the excellent residential co-ordinator the school has been dealing with. I apologise this was the case and would like to reassure you that the quality of the experience your child will have whilst they are away, will far supersede the outdoor supervisors presentation skills. Urban Saints Westbrook, has been recommended by several schools as a superb Christian Residential Experience.</p>
