Answer: A map

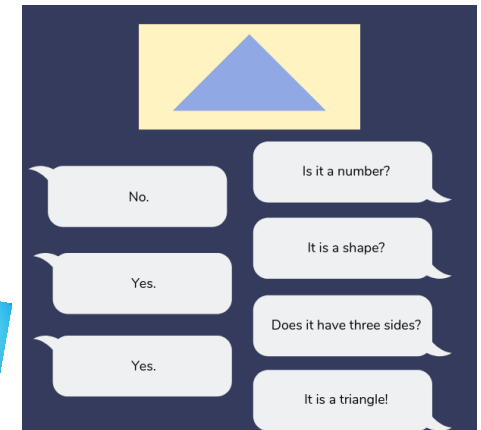


Maths (Yes / No Maths Game)
