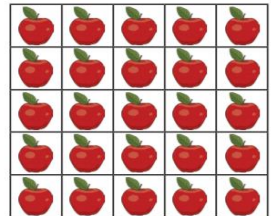

Phonics	Practise all sounds and tricky words on sound mats. The head superhero has a week of challenges for you. Have you got what it takes to join the Elite Superhero Squad? First challenge! On your whiteboards think of some superhero words you could write using your phonic brain. How many can you write? Make some up too. <i>b/oo/m z/a/p p/ow wh/a/m k/a/p/ow</i>	Practise all sounds and tricky words on sound mats. With your adult play silly sentences. Write a few sentence starters on strips of scrap paper. E.g My sister sat on a ____ .My nan jumped onto the ____ .Next write a few silly answers and muddle them up. Next is the fun bit. Pick a sentence and a silly answer and put them together. Read out!	Practise all sounds and tricky words on sound mats. Make some tricky word cards and put them into a container – play a tricky word game with your family. You be the teacher today, pull out a card and read the word to your family. Can they read it too? A few more for you... <i>little/people/boy/you/are/could</i>	Practise all sounds and tricky words on sound mats. Superhero nonsense word day! Is it a real hero word or an Evil Gloopy Head word, which we do not want do we! Put the real words on a drawing of your hero and the non words on a drawing of Gloopy! Non words do not make any sense! Gloopy likes words like <i>chonk/fonber/chobs</i>
Reading and Writing	Top Secret Mission! Come up with your own superhero identity. Make a poster with a picture of you as your superhero. What is your superhero name? What are your special powers? Write them onto your poster too. Make sure you can read your own writing.	Danger! Danger! Danger! Write a note to the other superheroes to warn them that Evil Gloopy Head is planning a gloop attack! What is your plan? What do you need to write a good sentence? Finger spaces, capital letters, full stops and phonics. Read your writing carefully.	Superhero Maps! 3 of your friends are trapped in a swamp on a desert island owned by Evil Gloopy Head. Draw an label a map that you can follow to rescue your friends. Make it clear and don't forget to include any dangers or help you may find along the way. Good luck!	Your own Superhero Story Mission. Plan a superhero mission for all the superheroes.
