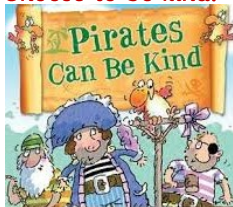
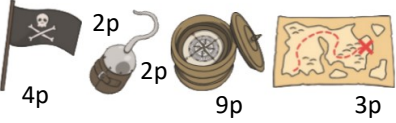




EYFS weekly planning for school closure: Wb 11.5.20

Phonics	Practise all sounds and tricky words on the sound card. The Pirate Captain has a week of challenges for you. Have you got what it takes to join the Cap'n Howlett Squad? First challenge! Write these tricky words (words that cannot be sounded out) without looking! was/ they/ all/ you/ me/ be How was it? Need more? Or more practise needed?	Practise all sounds and tricky words on the sound card.  Can you talk like a pirate? Ask a grown up to read these words... can you read them? fart/ sharp/ shark/ dart/ bark How many more can you think of and write with the 'ar' sound in?	Practise all sounds and tricky words on the sound card.  They will go off the plank. Read the sentence above. Can you write another sentence to go with the picture?	Practise all sounds and tricky words on the sound card.  Use the digraphs (written sounds with two letters) or/ar/ur/oo to play the game Treasure or Trash. Write your words on some made coins and sort them into real or fake! (keep the words after!)	Practise all sounds and tricky words on the sound card. Use the words from yesterdays phonics to hide around the house. With another person in your house, go on a Pirate Phonics Treasure Hunt. Who can find and read the most in 3 minutes? Take it turns to hide the words and find/ read them! 
English—Reading/ Writing	Join the crew! Come up with your own Pirate identity. Make a poster with a picture of you as your Pirate. What is your Pirate name? What is your special trick? Write them onto your poster too. Make sure you can read your own writing. 	Danger! Danger! The pirate ship is under attack! Draw a picture of yourself with a speech bubble. What would you say to the enemy? Don't forget what you need for a good sentence. 	Choose to be kind!  Pirates aren't always very kind to each other! Can you write down some tips to help them to be better friends?	Pirate Party! It is time to plan a Pirate Party! Write a list of things you might need for a pirate party! What will you eat? What will you where? Can you make an invitation to the party? Make some decorations! Take some pictures and share with us on Tapestry! 	Treasure Map! Choose some treasure and hide it in your house. Draw a treasure map for someone else in your house to find it! Remember X marks the spot! Label 4 things on your map—use your phonics to help sound out the words for spelling! 
Maths	Draw 2 ships and 10 birds (simple!) Cut out the birds. Share them between the two ships.  How many different ways are there to do this? Write them down as sums. e.g 1 + 9 etc	11 5 12 8 9 7 10 Put these numbers in the correct order. Which numbers are missing? Can you write them in? Can you complete the number line to 20?	 Add up how much money you would need to buy: 1 flag + 1 map 1 hook + 1 compass 1 map + 1 hook What about if you wanted to but it all?	Pirate Pete has 20 coins in his chest. Pirate Paul only has 10. How many does Pete need to give to Paul to make it equal and fair? Make coins and share them out to test it out! 	These are even numbers: 2 4 6 8 10 You can share this amount of sweets/ crisps/ grapes evenly between 2 or more people. Can you test it out? These are odd numbers: 7 5 3 9 1 Can you share these number of sweets out fairly between you and 1 more?

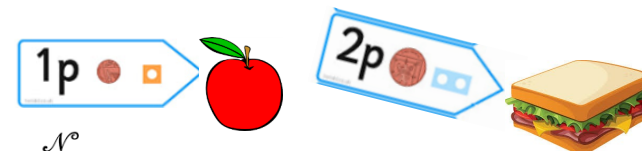
Window Wonderland

Maths Challenge

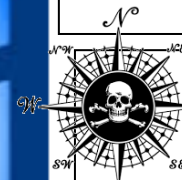
Ask a grown up to find some 1p and 2p coins—if you don't have any, make some out of paper!
