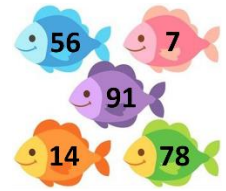

Phonics	Practise all the sounds and tricky words on your sound mats. Scuba Diving Challenge! Swim under the water and grab a base word. You then need to bring your base word back to the surface and add the suffix -ed.  Submarine Challenge – Can you write a sentence including your new words? Name the Creatures There are so many creatures who live under the sea. Can you write a list of all the sea creatures you know? Then, to help you tell who is who, give each of the creatures a silly name that starts with the same sound.  Shorb the shark Pem the pufferfish Tave the turtle 	Practise all the sounds and tricky words on your sound mats. Blue Whale bingo! Draw a 3 by 3 grid and write down a different tricky word in each box, using your tricky words mat. Then, ask an adult or sibling to read out different tricky words. If they say one of yours cross it out. When you have crossed out all your tricky words call out bingo!

Draw a map of under the sea and write sentences to tell the fish which way to go to get home. Remember - The fish will need to swim under, over and through things so include this in your instructions.	Under the sea, what can you see? Imagine you are inside a submarine under the sea. What can you see out of the window? Create a mind-map using adjectives to describe all the things you can see. Can you include expanded noun phrases? Scaly, sparkly fish. Submarine challenge - Using your mind map, can you write sentences about the things you can see?	Acrostic in the Deep Sea Can you create your own acrostic poem? Choose a word from below and get writing! submarine turtle shell Submarine challenge – Can you think of your own sea related word and write an acrostic poem?	Create a Sea Creature! Make your own sea creature. Then, write a fact file about your sea creature. What is its name? Where does it live in the sea? Does it have family? What colour is it? What does it look like? Can you draw 20 shells and write your number bonds to 20 on them? 1 + 19 = 20 20 + 0 = 20  Submarine challenge – Can you write subtraction number sentences using your number bond knowledge to 20.	Fish Ordering  Can you help the scuba diver order these fish from youngest to oldest? Can you also order them from oldest to youngest? Submarine challenge – Can you use the greater than and less than signs (<, >) to compare the ages of the fish?	Sea Creature Adding The scuba diver dove really deep into the sea today and saw lots of different sea creatures. But he lost count of how many he saw altogether! Can you help him add all the sea creatures together? He saw 3 octopus, 2 turtles, 6 fish and 1 shark! Submarine challenge – Yesterday the scuba diver saw 45 sea creatures. How many sea creatures has he seen altogether in the last two days?	Silly Sea Creature Creations Your scuba diver challenge today is to make your own silly sea creature!
