Draw a 3 by 3 square grid and write down a different phase 5 sound in each box. Ask a grown up or sibling to then read out the phase 5 sounds on your sound mat. If they say one of your sounds cross it out. Can you get 3 in a row? Or a full house? If you get a full house or a row shout out 'AHOY!' or 'ARRGH!' like a pirate. What is the reward? What does he look like? Pirate Challenge – Can you use an expanded noun phrase when describing what he looks like?	Directions Map Remember your wanted poster? Someone has replied saying they have seen Captain Redbeard! He's hiding in a cave with your coins on pirate island. Can you draw a map to show how you are going to get to Captain Redbeard? Remember – To label your map and think about the things you will need to go through, under and over. 	A Message in a Bottle Ahoy Matey! Maths	Pirate Problem 14 coins are found in a treasure chest. Bernie gets 6 and Aisha gets 5. How many coins does Basil get?  Pirate Challenge – Change the number of coins found in the treasure chest and work out how many coins Basil gets.	Double Trouble We asked you to pack food for your pirate adventure but... we forgot to tell you that you need food for your parrot too! Don't worry though as it should be easy as you just need to double your food. Can you write the number sentences to show your calculations? You need to double: 8 bananas (8 + 8 or 8 x 2) 3 loaves of bread 5 apples 2 chocolate bars 14 bottles of water Pirate Challenge – Can you add them altogether?	Treasure Map Hide a special object in your house. Then give directions to someone in your house to help them find your hidden treasure. Can you use the words forward, backward, left, right, quarter turn, half turn, three-quarter turn, full turn, anticlockwise and clockwise? 	That's not fair! Now that we have our treasure back from Captain Redbeard the coins need to be shared equally between the pirate crew. Can you help?  There are 5 pirate bags and 20 coins. Can you share the coins into the pirate bags? Is it fair? Do all the pirates have an equal amount of coins? Pirate Challenge – Can you find another way that 20 coins can be shared out equally?
