You must design a picture, and write sentences about how it works, how it is safe, what gadgets it has, how or where do you see out of it, is it heavy or light? NASA will judge whether it is space safe!	You are about to take off in your rocket. The countdown is on (10, 9, 8, 7...) and you have so many exciting thoughts going through your brain! Can you write a diary entry about how you are feeling sat in the rocket about to take off? What things you hope to see in space? What are you going to space for?
