Phonics	Practise all sounds and tricky words on the sound card. Benjamin Bumble has a week of challenges for you! First challenge! Using your phonics can you make a list of all the minibeasts you can think of? Grown ups... these don't need to be spelt correctly, just phonetically (as they sound when spoken e.g. lady—laidee is fine!	Practise all sounds and tricky words on the sound card. It is a bug. The bug has spots. It can jump in the air. The bugs are on the tree. Ask a grown up to write out the sentences with sound buttons for you. Can you read them and draw a picture to go with each one? 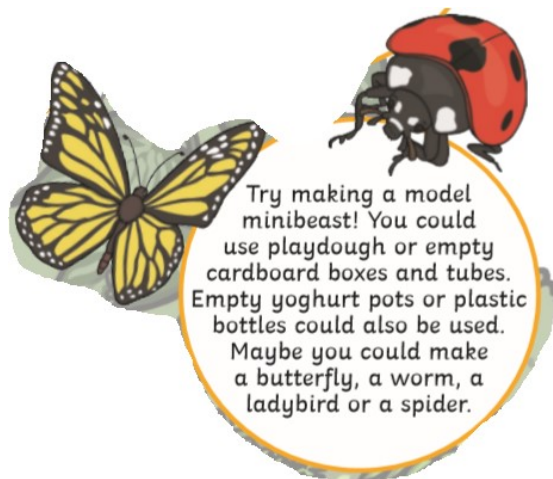

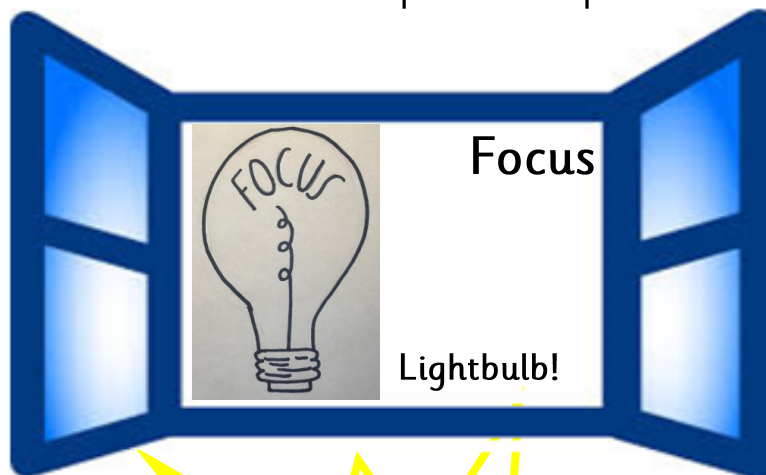
