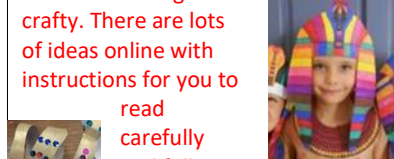

Use Left, right, sideways, turn around, step over, go under, below, behind etc... You could make a fun game of it and maybe even blindfold your adult and give them directions to follow.
