Maybe you could mark them on a world map if you have a printer! 	Did you know?  Over half the world's types of plants and animals live in the jungle! The jungle is very warm and very wet! Can you find out and write down another fact about the Jungle/ Rainforest?	What am I?  I lurk in the water, with skin green and rough.  Sharp, pointy teeth and jaws that are tough. Answer: Crocodile! Can you choose a Jungle animal and write your own riddle for us to guess what it is? Post it on Tapestry!									
Maths	How many stripes?! Ziggy and Zaggy the Zebras have lost their stripes!! Can you help find them? Draw 2 Zebras. On your way through the Jungle, you found 20 zebra stripes. Share the stripes between the two Zebras <u>equally</u>. How many stripes does each Zebra have now?	Swinging in the Tree  12 monkeys are swinging through the Jungle, jumping across the trees. 5 of them stop to eat a banana. How many are left now? 3 decide to go for a swim. How many monkeys are left in the trees?	Ostrich organisation! 7 Ostriches run through the desert. They join a group of another 9 Ostriches. How many are there altogether now? 	Meerkat madness!  5 cheeky meerkats are having a party. Can you help them sort out the food they need? They want 4 biscuits each, 2 chocolate ones and 2 jam ones. How many do they need of each biscuit and how many biscuits do they need altogether?	Run away Wildebeest! 20 Wildebeest are grazing. 3 get scared and run away. How many are left? Can you write out the subtraction sum and answer?

Draw and about 5 live there!



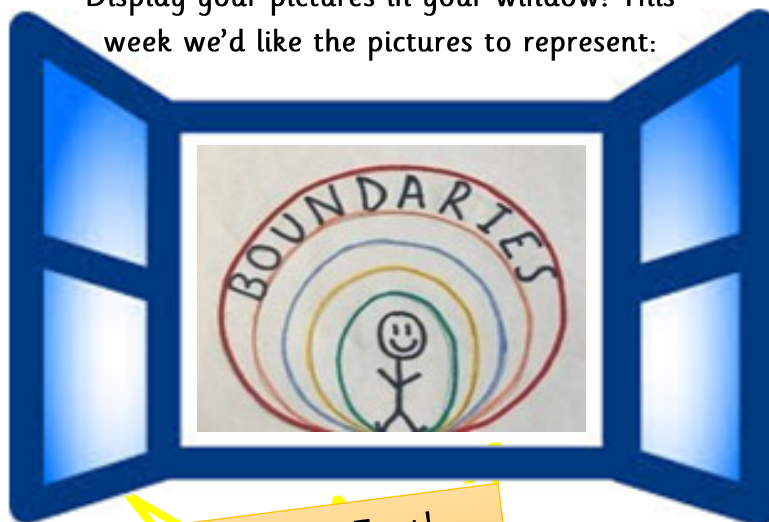

Choose 3 animals from the jungle and draw a picture showing them in size order, from the biggest to the smallest.

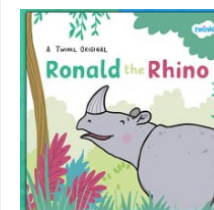
Creativity Challenge—Shoe Box Jungle
