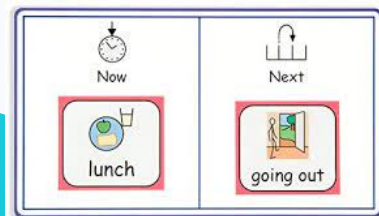

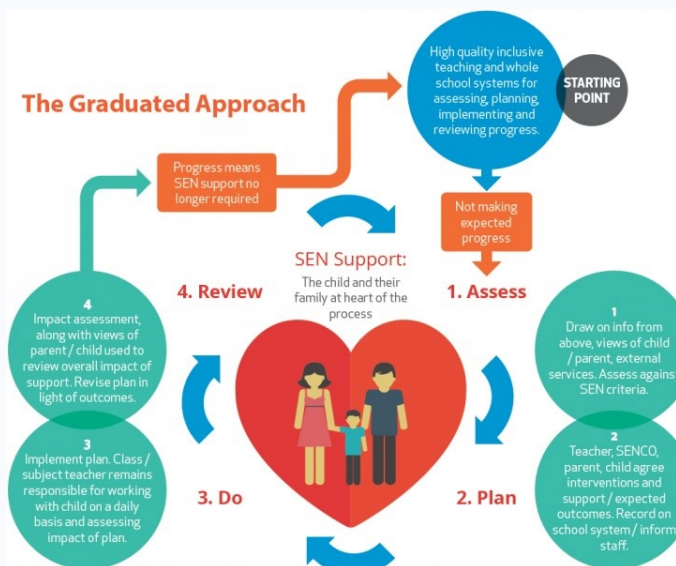

SEN Support Tips for Parents

English Support



READING

Before Reading

Children with SEN can be visual learners and therefore looking at the pictures within a book can support children to get a feel for what the book might be about, aid understanding and to provide context around the words they may come across.

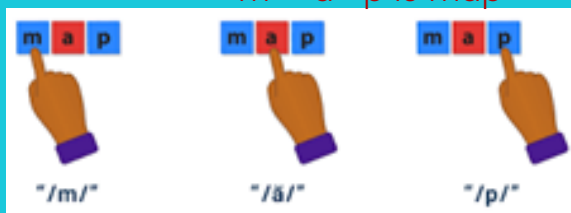
PHONICS

Encourage your child to get their mouth ready to make the first sound. A mirror can help them with this to see the shape of their mouth when making different sounds.



Encourage them to sound it out and put sounds together!
