

DEFINITION OF SAFEGUARDING

- Protecting children and young people (under the age of 18) from maltreatment
- Preventing impairment of children's health or development
- Ensuring that children grow up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care
- Take action to enable children to have the best outcomes



A child means everyone under the age of 18.



Children need the right help at the right time to address risks



Remember 'it could happen here' where safeguarding is concerned.



We are all responsible for the welfare of children and keeping the environment safe, whatever our job.

Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility

TYPES OF ABUSE:

Physical: hitting, shaking, throwing, poisoning, burning or scalding. It could also be fabrication, such as deliberately inducing illness in a child.

Sexual: involves forcing or enticing a child to take part in sexual activities.

Emotional: the persistent emotional maltreatment of a child such as to cause severe and adverse effects on the child's emotional development and wellbeing.

Neglect: the persistent failure to meet a child's basic or physical or psychological needs, likely to result in the serious impairment of the child's health or development.

Female Genital Mutilation (FGM):

Procedures that involve partial or total removal of the external female genitalia for non-medical reasons.

Radicalisation: refers to the process by which a person comes to support terrorism and extremist ideologies associated with terrorist groups.
